

## Ebooks from the UCSC Library

The University Library offers a large and growing collection of ebooks from many publishers on a variety of platforms. Ebooks are listed in Cruzcat and may be found via the standard catalog searches. You may also connect to the ebook databases directly and search and/or browse the database. Ebooks available for purchase are typically protected by embedded Digital Rights Management (DRM) software. Most of our ebooks are Adobe Digital Editions compatible so you may wish to ensure that your device supports [ADE](#) and/or install the free program prior to searching. EBL now offers downloads using ePub ebook file format with more flexible viewing/formatting options.

Below you will find information regarding searching and downloading books from our major aggregator (not publisher specific) platforms, Ebook Library (EBL), Ebrary, and Ebooks on EBSCOHost (formerly NetLibrary). [Ebrary](#) is a collection of over 30,000 online full text books in a variety of subject areas. The ebrary **QuickView Reader** runs within your web browser and works with Windows, Mac OS, and Linux. **QuickView** allows instant viewing of documents in your browser. To print, copy, or use other advanced features, you can use the **InfoTools** menu from **QuickView**.

**Ebrary Readers:** Two other readers are also available: 1) the **Unity Reader** (Windows, Linux; includes text-to-speech functionality). The Unity Reader works well with newer browser versions OR the 2) **Ebrary Plugin Reader** which offers more functionality and better results in printing. To install it click on the button to launch.

**SIMULTANEOUS USERS:** Ebrary Academic subscribed titles allow simultaneous multi-user access. UCSC also provides access to limited number of purchased single-user titles. SUPO titles become available to another patron once the user logs out, selects



[EBL \(Electronic Book Library\)](#) is a platform hosts over 100,000 titles from hundreds of academic publishers. The UCSC Library provides access to ~1,000 of these titles but patrons may lease or purchase other EBL You can discover EBL titles by searching Cruzcat --the titles will be identified by [EBL ebook library](#) in the Other Title field.

You should install [Adobe Reader](#) (free of charge to download) prior to viewing these books.

**SIMULTANEOUS USERS:** EBL allows multiple users to access a single ebook at one time.

**DOWNLOADING** Read Online is the best option to choose unless you need to read the book when you are not connected to the internet, or if you want to use it on a portable device. Downloading a book gives you access to it later when you are no longer online, or if you want to load it onto a hand held device. You choose how long you wish to access the book, 1-3 days..



### EBOOKS on EBSCOHost

The UCSC Library owns approximately 7,000 titles from Ebooks on EBSCO Host. You can discover these titles by searching Cruzcat --the titles are identified by [NetLibrary](#) in the Author field.

**SIMULTANEOUS USERS:** Ebooks on EBSCOHost allows only one user at a time to access the title, unless we have purchased multiple copies. Because of this, we limit checkouts to a 24 hour period for most books.

### PRINTING

Ebooks on EBSCOHost normally allows printing of the bibliographic citation **ONLY** from the viewer.

### DOWNLOADING

*Not all of these books are downloadable.* You may download the book to a personal device for a 1 hour – 7 day loan period. Afterwards, the item will disappear from the remote device. While that

**PRINTING** Printing is limited to 40 continuous pages, or a total of 60 pages from a single book.

**DOWNLOADING** ebrary now offers the following two download options for offline access to ebrary content:

- Create an image PDF of a specific chapter or page range. [Learn more.](#)
- Same page limits as for printing.
- Accessible on most computers and devices, including the Kindle.
- Additional (free) software is typically not needed.
- Files do not expire.

- Patrons first need to install [Adobe Digital Editions](#).

- Accessible on most computers and devices, but not the Kindle.
  - Up to 10 documents at a time per patron.
  - Multi-user documents can be full-document downloaded for 14 days\*.
  - Single-user-only documents cannot be downloaded.

## FAQs

**Do I need special software or hardware to read ebrary books online?**

ebrary requires you to use one of their ebrary Readers to view and

After this period the book will remain on your computer or device, but you will need to return to EBL to borrow the book again to be able to read it.

Downloading an EBL book enables you to access the book offline and transfer it to a device that supports Adobe Digital Editions—see: Adobe Digital Editions list of compatible devices: <http://blogs.adobe.com/digitalpublishing/supported-devices>. Apple devices (IPAD, iPhone etc.) normally require the [BlueFire Reader](#) to work with Adobe Digital. One library prepared a [YouTube video](#) to demonstrate how this works.

**PRINTING** EBL allows users only to print 20% of a book's content (does not have to be consecutive pages). Only 5% of the book can be copied and pasted.

## FAQs

**Do I need special software or hardware to read ebooks online?**

EBL can be accessed using a standard Internet browser. The [Safari browser](#) is recommended for Mac users. EBL provides ebooks in Adobe PDF format, so in order to view EBL ebooks online, you will need the correct version of [Adobe Reader](#) installed on your computer. EBL works best with Acrobat Reader version 9 or later. If you download Adobe Reader 8, you will also need to download [Adobe Digital Edition - Flash Player](#).

Adobe® Digital Editions 1.7.1 or higher is required for offline viewing. This free software can be downloaded from this [link](#). These downloadable ebooks are compatible with ebook readers such as the Barnes & Noble NOOK, Sony Reader Daily Edition, Sony Digital Readers (PRS-300, 505, 600 and 700BC).

**NOTE:** Users must create a new and unique account for use during the Preview only. Information stored (including username, password and eBook information) will be deleted after the Preview ends.

## To download an eBook:

Click the Download (Offline) link for the eBook you would like to download.

Select a **Checkout period** from the drop-down menu and click the Checkout & Download button. UCSC books only allows checkouts for a 24 hour period, however you may renew the title. Consortia books may be checked out for 7 days.

The eBook is added to the Checkout area of the folder, accessible from the upper-right corner of the *EBSCOhost* interface. If you are not logged into your *My EBSCOhost* folder, you are prompted to do so.

Select to **Open** or **Save** the file

<p>interact with documents and for expanded functionality. The <b>ebrary QuickView Reader</b> runs within your web browser and works with Windows, Mac OS, and Linux. The <b>ebrary Plug-in Reader</b> runs inside your web browser and is available on Windows and Mac OS. You download and install the Plug-in Reader as a browser plug-in. The Plug-in Reader performs essentially the same tasks as the ebrary QuickView Reader. Both are available from the ebrary website.</p> <p><b>Can I download ebooks to my hand held device (like my phone, my Kindle, my Sony Reader)?</b></p> <p>It depends. You may not be able to use a personal ebooks reader, such as the Kindle, if the DRM controls are not compatible. See “Downloading” section.</p> <p><b>Can I print from ebrary? Can I copy and paste from ebrary?</b></p> <p>Yes, within the copyright restrictions of the title, you can print chapters, sections or pages you wish to use for your research. You can also select text and copy it to another application.</p>	<p><b>phone, e-book reader or tablet?</b></p> <p>Yes, whenever the DOWNLOAD button appears in a book you are reading, you can download the book for 24 hours. Printing from EBL is restricted to approximately 20% of the total pages of the ebook, per user. Copying and pasting content is restricted to approximately 5% of the total pages of the ebook, per user. EBL will display a message if the limit is reached.</p>	<p>from the resulting dialog box.</p> <p>If you <b>Open</b> the file, your eBook is opened with Adobe® Digital Editions.</p> <p>If you <b>Save</b> the file, the eBook is saved to your computer and can be opened with Adobe® Digital Editions at a later time.</p> <p>When a downloaded eBook is opened, it is displayed in Adobe® Digital Editions.</p> <p>NOT ALL Ebooks on EbscoHost can be downloaded. [CRCnetBASE](#): access to CRC Press reference books via sub-databases in the fields of forensics, food science, information technology, biosciences, pharmaceuticals, engineering, mathematics, and statistics.

[e-Duke Books Scholarly Collection](#): Access to over 1,200 books from Duke University Press, hosted on the Ebrary Platform.

[Gale Virtual Reference Library](#): A collection of over 170 reference books on various subjects.

[Oxford Reference Online Premium](#): includes ~300 cross-searchable dictionary, language references, and subject reference works. See also [Oxford Handbooks Online](#).

[Oxford Scholarship Online](#): Offers electronic access to books in biology, business and management, classical studies, economics and finance, history, law, linguistics, literature, mathematics, music, neuroscience, philosophy, physics, political science, psychology, public health and epidemiology, religion and social work.
